



Time to Rethink Your Sourcing

#### **European Weather Challenges:**

Adverse weather conditions across many parts of Europe are expected to reduce crop sizes in 2025, adding further pressure to regional supply.

#### **Support from other Origins:**

While California's bumper harvest contributes to global stability,
European buyers gain little benefit due to import taxes. Instead, nearby regions such as Bulgaria, Turkey, and Egypt remain the most cost-effective alternative sourcing options.

#### **Grower Hesitation:**

Continued low raw material prices, following high levels of carry-over stock from 2024, have led to reduced planting activity.

#### Change in Grower's Strategy:

By reducing the planting activity of tomatoes, growers are trying to support an increase in raw material prices in 2026, allowing them to generate greater income from their crops.







# Egypt

#### Overview:

• Transition period follows until 10-mid November before Nili crop harvest begins (mainly Sharkia, Beni Suif, Al-Fayoum, and limited quantities from Al-Minya, which peaks in the winter crop).

#### Forecast:

· Forecast remains unchanged at 780,000 tonnes.





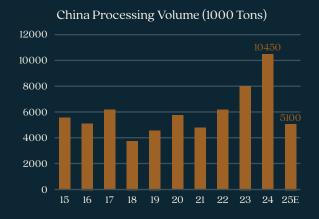
# China

#### Overview:

- · No major change in forecast so far.
- · Likely to decline further, updated details expected soon.

#### Forecast

• Estimated 5.1m tonnes to be processed.





### Greece

#### Overview:

- · Harvest progressing smoothly, no issues reported.
- · Central region (75% already harvested) expected to finish shortly.

#### **Forecast**

· Forecast remains at 450.000 tonnes.



# Turkey

#### Overview:

- · Southern region harvest completed 5 September.
- Bursa region: ~50% harvested; speed expected to increase over next 2 weeks (due to late planting bunching from high heat).
- · Yields in later harvests are lower than expected.
- · Konya region harvest ongoing.

#### Forecast

· Forecast reduced to 2.2m tonnes.



## Portugal

#### Overview:

- Crop delayed: only ~30% processed so far.
- Irregular ripening: 25–30% green tomatoes left behind in some fields.
- Some fields are still too green, requiring delayed harvest; most delayed fields were flooded in April.
- Despite irregularity: good colour, brix improved from low early levels to above average now.
- Next 3 weeks crucial; harvest likely to extend into October (duration uncertain).

#### Forecast

• Forecast holds at 1.4m tonnes to 1.35m tonnes.

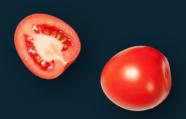
# Spain •

#### Overview:

- Harvest delayed: by 31 August, only 47% processed (vs. normal 63%).
- Extremadura: only 20–40% completed; harvest finishing around 10 October.
- Yields: down ~20% in Andalusia; variable but mostly lower in Extremadura.
- Brix levels are generally higher than normal.
- Weather: cooler now, but rain forecast for the weekend.
- · No factories currently at full capacity.

#### **Forecast**

 Forecast reduced from 2.5 to 2.4 million tonnes; final outcome depends on September harvest.



# Bulgaria

#### Overview:

- About 50% harvested; factories running at full capacity.
- Quality better than last year, with brix slightly above 5.
- Season expected to finish on target by the end of September.

#### **Forecast**

· Forecast unchanged at 43,000 tonnes.



#### Overview:

#### • North:

- As of 24 August: 1.62 million tonnes processed, average brix 5.21, penalties 4.62.
- Quality is good, but there are excess green tomatoes due to staggered ripening.
- Heavy rains in late August caused non-harvest days and factory closures.
- Yields below average despite record planting (45,000 hectares).

#### • Centre-South:

- Factories at less than 50% capacity due to poor ripening.
- Split maturation: some ripe fruit, many greens remain in fields.
- Yields are the worst in 10 years after a strong start. Processors paying higher prices, especially for long varieties.
- Extended crop season: 15 July early October.

#### Forecast

• Total national forecast reduced from 5.8 to 5.5 million tonnes, pending September conditions.
